Cathodic Protection and Underground Propane Tanks – Mike Fisher

The 2011 version of NFPA58 has created new rules concerning underground tanks. This seminar will review cathodic protection in general, explain the new rules and discuss how to be in compliance. It will also look at various monitoring equipment and sample forms for documentation.

The course is the site of regional qualifying for the U.S. Open.

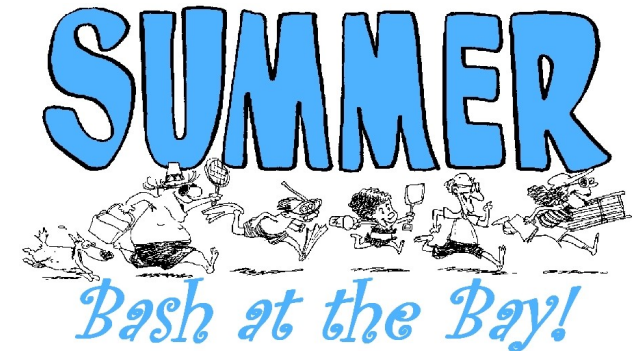
Breakfast Buffet & Annual Meetings

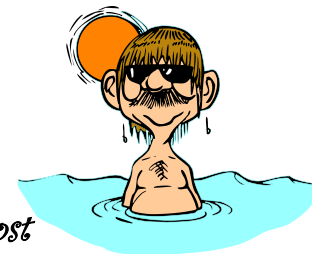
